### From the Deacon's Desk:

Changes in the Revised Roman Missal: consubstantial with the Father is a change from one in being with the Father in the Creed. To be consubstantial means that Jesus shares the same and equal nature with the Father. Being means that He was created and His existence is dependent and less than the Father. This change in terminology helps us understand that He is God, not dependent on anyone and is equal with the Father and the Holy Spirit.
